LV-2016-01 —Staff presented the application by McBride Dale Clarion for a variance from the Lilburn Sign Ordinance to allow two 47.25 SF signs and two 17 SF signs (128 sf total) on the fuel canopy proposed for development with a convenience store on property zoned CB-commercial business. The 3.9 acres of property is located at 5604 Lawrenceville Highway, being in District 6, Land Lot 145, Parcels 027A, 253, 122, and 027. There was no opposition or comment during public notice. Staff recommended approval of the variance from the eight square foot limit on canopies based on the total square footage of all signage proposed on the site, in accordance with Lilburn Sign Ordinance which provides for variance approval.

Jonathan Wocher speaking on behalf of the applicant presented the application and reiterated the intent to reduce signage on the building in exchange for larger signs on the canopy. He further described the convenience store business, Speedway, which includes a store-brand Speedy Café.

Williams made a motion to approve LV-2016-01 as submitted. Second by Stallsmith. All voted in favor of approval.
