Assistant City Manager

Director of Planning

Joellen Wilson will be assuming a new role as Director of Planning. Joellen's responsibilities will include managing the activities and staff of the planning and zoning, building inspections, code enforcement, stormwater, and redevelopment services for the city. Joellen has served as the City Planner for the past five years.

Emily Harvey

Municipal Court Administrator

Emily Harvey recently achieved state certification as a Municipal Court Administrator. She is responsible for daily operations of the court, to include the maintenance of citations, court records and reports. She manages a staff of three employees and together they provide excellent administrative support for the court. Emily has worked in Municipal Court for the past four years.

2019/2020 Budget Approved

The City of Lilburn budget for the new fiscal year, July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020, was approved by Lilburn City Council on June 10. This followed a public hearing that was held on May 21.

The property tax rate is proposed to remain the same, 4.43 mils, and is scheduled to be adopted at the Lilburn City Council meeting on July 8 at 7:30 p.m. at Lilburn City Hall, 340 Main Street. The budget includes a sanitation fee of \$13.25 per

month for each residential property owner. The slight increase from the previous year is due to a legislative mandate.

Additional info for Sparkle in the Park:

Shuttles & Parking: Offsite parking will be available at the lots located at Lilburn City Hall-Library, Killian Hill Road & Poplar Street, and Main & Young Streets. Accessible parking will be available on a first come, first served basis at Lilburn City Park (76 Main Street).

What to bring: Lawn chairs or blankets are recommended. There isn't a bank machine near the park, so please plan accordingly.

What to leave at home: No outside alcohol is allowed and coolers are subject to search. Beer and wine will be sold at the event. Tents and grills are not allowed. No outside fireworks or sparklers.

Smoking is prohibited in the park. Due to the large crowd and fireworks, it is recommended that pets not be brought to the event.

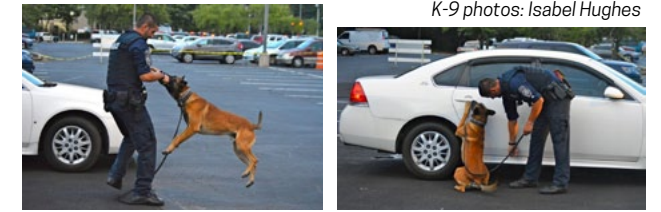
