



## Fall brings variety of events

**T**he year may be winding down, but there are still plenty of exciting, community events to enjoy in Lilburn.

Bring your lawn chair or blanket and join your neighbors in Lilburn City Park on Saturday, September 7 for a FREE concert featuring Head Games-A Tribute to Foreigner. Food and beverage vendors open at 6 p.m. and special guest, Shaky Jane, will perform at 6:15 p.m. Head Games plays all of the classic songs of Foreigner along with other favorites from the '70s, '80s, and '90s.

Food trucks return to Lilburn City Park on the second Tuesday of the month in September and October. On September 10 and October 8, take a break from cooking and come to downtown Lilburn. A variety of food trucks will be in the park waiting to take your order. The events also include live music from the bandshell.

The Community Yard Sale takes place on Saturday, September 28 in the greenway parking lot, across Main Street from Lilburn City Park. This popular event typically has 30+ vendors, so there should be a lot of great treasures to be found.

The Lilburn Police Department is offering the two final Women's Self Defense classes for 2019 on September 18-19 and November 20-21. Risk awareness, risk reduction, and crime prevention strategies are some of the topics that will be covered. This FREE two-day program is open to women 18 years of age and older or ages 12 to 17 with a guardian. Space is limited and advance registration is required.

Lilburn Daze celebrates its 46th year on October 12 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in Lilburn City Park! This annual festival features arts and crafts vendors, games, children's activities, food, and entertainment. Parking and admission are free and shuttle transportation is provided. ## Lilburn Construction Update

**Lilburn City Park restrooms:** The new restrooms in Lilburn City Park are scheduled to be open in early September. The building was designed to accommodate larger events in the park, in addition to daily park attendance. This project was funded through 2017 SPLOST Recreation/Capital Projects Fund.

**Camp Creek Greenway Improvements:** Improvements were made to several boardwalk approaches on Camp Creek Greenway. AquaGuard Foundation Solutions utilized an injection system to lift low concrete slabs at approaches to provide for smoother transitions.



**Jackson Creek Trail Project:** This 10-foot wide multiuse trail along Highway 29 extends from Jackson Creek, near Indian Trail Lilburn Road, to Postal Way. The trail is funded through a Transportation Enhancement Grant and 2017 SPLOST Transportation Fund and will eventually tie in to a county wide trail system. Landscaping will be added by the Lilburn CID in January/February 2020.



**Police Headquarters and Court Complex:** Construction is moving along on the new facility located on Lawrenceville Highway. This 2017 SPLOST Public Safety funded project, is scheduled to be completed in October/November 2019.

**Wynne-Russell House:** The historic Wynne-Russell House recently received some improvements. The exterior of the house was stripped and then hand primed and painted. Visitors to the home will also notice a newly paved and lined parking lot.

## City to hold two elections Nov. 5

### General election for Mayor and City Council

The City of Lilburn will hold a general municipal election on Nov. 5, 2019 for Lilburn Mayor and City Council Posts 1 and 2. The Mayor and council members serve four-year terms and are elected at large, meaning that each member serves all city residents.

### Brunch Bill special election

The City of Lilburn will also hold a municipal special election for the determination of a referendum, also known as the Brunch Bill, authorizing the city to permit and regulate Sunday sales of distilled spirits and/or alcoholic beverages by the drink from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The municipal special election will be held along with the general municipal election on Nov. 5 at Lilburn City Hall, 340 Main St. from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. The advanced voting period begins Oct. 14 and ends Nov. 1. Voters must come to Lilburn City Hall to vote in the municipal elections, which are separate from the general election conducted by Gwinnett County Voter Registrations and Elections Office. The City of Lilburn has posted public notices regarding this election in English and Spanish to satisfy the requirements of the Voting Rights Act, 52 United States Constitution §10503.

## Room dedicated in memory of Diana Preston

On August 19, the first floor meeting room at Lilburn City Hall was officially named “The Preston” in honor of former mayor, council member, educator, and longtime public servant, Diana Preston. City officials, members of the community, and Mrs. Preston’s family gathered for the dedication and unveiling of the sign, prominently displayed above the entrance to the room.

Mrs. Preston served on the Lilburn City Council for 22 years and was elected mayor in 2007. She was involved in many projects while at the city, including the creation of Camp Creek Greenway Trail. She worked for Gwinnett County Public Schools for 30 years and created the non-profit organization, Lilburn Community Partnership.
