



# Celebrate the Holidays in Lilburn!

**T**he holidays are almost upon us and the City of Lilburn has several opportunities for the community to get in the spirit.

On Saturday, November 23, join the City of Lilburn for the lighting of the spectacular 25+ ft. tree outside Lilburn City Hall-Library at 340 Main Street. The event starts at 6 p.m. and will include live holiday music, a \*kid's craft opportunity, visits from holiday characters, and more! New this year, guests will want to bring their cameras to have their picture taken inside a life-sized snow globe! Hot chocolate and sweet treats will be available for purchase at the event. Join in the countdown as the night concludes with the lighting of the big tree. The event takes place both inside and outside. Dress warm, you never know when it might snow in Lilburn.

Main Street will be full of holiday cheer on Saturday, December 7 as the annual Lilburn Christmas Parade comes to town! The parade starts at 10 a.m. near the intersection of Main Street and Church Street, travels down Main Street, and ends in downtown Lilburn near the intersection of Main Street and Railroad Avenue. More than 1,200 people are expected to participate in the

parade, which includes floats, marching bands, performers, costumed characters, and more! After the parade, be sure to stop by Lilburn City Hall-Library where kids can make a \*craft and visit with Santa Claus.

Guests attending the Tree Lighting and Christmas Parade will have an opportunity to visit the "Deck the Hall" tree decorating inside city hall to find out how they might be able to win a new, decorated, artificial Christmas tree. Trees will be on display during both events.

Enjoy a holiday open house and bake sale at the Wynne Russell House on Saturday, December 7, courtesy of the Lilburn Community Partnership Wynne-Russell House Preservation Board. The event takes place from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. and includes a tour of the historic home, complimentary refreshments (limited amount), an opportunity to visit



with Santa, and a bake sale. The home, located at 4685 Wynne-Russell Drive, is one of the oldest homes in Gwinnett County. Built in 1826, the house was restored and added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1975.

# Police Department offers variety of programs

You may have attended the Lilburn Police Department's award winning National Night Out event, which celebrated its 10th anniversary in August, but did you know that the department offers a variety of other free safety programs and services throughout the year? Officers visit schools, attend a variety of community events, and give presentations covering topics such as Bullying, Senior Scams, and Crime Prevention. Here are just some of the programs and services offered by the department.

**Free Car Seat Checks** - Specially trained officers perform car seat safety checks Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Lilburn Police Department. No appointment is necessary. Other times are available by appointment.

**Prescription Drug Drop-off** - Residents are encouraged to bring their expired and unwanted medications to the "Big White Box", located in the lobby of the Lilburn Police Department. The box is accessible to the public 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The "Big White Box" helps keep these drugs out of the hands of children and teens, off the street, prevent overdoses and accidental

poisonings, and avoid environmental contamination caused by throwing drugs in the toilet, sink, or trash.

**Create a Neighborhood or Business Watch** - Last year the Lilburn Police Department led 128 neighborhood watch and safety meetings and 30 neighborhood watch programs! By joining or creating a watch program, residents are able to get to know the officer who patrols their neighborhood and discuss preventing and solving crime specific to that area.

**Women's Self Defense Program** - This popular two-day, comprehensive



course is offered several times a year. This free program includes class activities and discussions designed to help women identify their risks, evaluate their strengths, and explore their options for dealing with the threat of violence.

**Citizens Police Academy (CPA)** - Want to better understand police work in your community? This 13-week program is designed to educate and inform citizens about issues that face law enforcement efforts in the City of Lilburn. The two-hour class is held on consecutive Thursday nights over a 13 week period. A separate area of the department is covered each week. The next CPA program takes place early next year.

## Protecting Stormwater in Lilburn Protects Our Streams

The City of Lilburn is truly one of Georgia's small town gems. With beautiful parks, trails, and streams, it is important to protect our environment by preventing stormwater pollution.



Stormwater becomes polluted through illicit discharges. An illicit discharge is when anything is put into a storm drain besides stormwater. Common examples include grass clippings, pet waste, used motor oil, and car washing residue. Since the stormwater drainage system and all of its components (storm drains, ditches, and pipes) are "open," stormwater can flow freely in and out of the system and into our waterways. In Lilburn, almost all of the stormwater ultimately reaches Jackson Creek or Camp Creek. So if stormwater can flow freely into our waterbodies, an illicit discharge can as well!

To prevent stormwater pollution, remember the simple phrase, "Only Rain in the Drain!" Here are a few tips to help you protect stormwater quality:

- Pick up after your pets when on your walk and in your own backyard
- Wash your car on a grassy area where wash water can soak in, or take it to a car wash
- Compost leaves and grass clippings instead of blowing them into the street or down the drain

To help stop illicit discharges from occurring, the City of Lilburn partners with the Gwinnett County Department of Water Resources to investigate stormwater pollution. If you see an illicit discharge, please report it at 678-376-7000. A Water Quality Investigator is dispatched to the area and will work to determine the source of the pollution to resolve the problem.

## City to hold two elections November 5

The City of Lilburn will hold a general municipal election on Nov. 5, 2019 for Lilburn Mayor and City Council Posts 1 and 2. The Mayor and council members serve four-year terms and are elected at large, meaning that each member serves all city residents.

The City of Lilburn will also hold a municipal special election for the determination of a referendum, also known as the Brunch Bill, authorizing the city to permit and regulate Sunday sales of distilled spirits and/or alcoholic beverages by the drink from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The municipal special election will be held along with the general municipal election on Nov. 5 at Lilburn City Hall, 340 Main St. from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Direct questions about the general municipal election and the municipal special election to Melissa Penate at 770-638-2226 or [mpenate@cityoflilburn.com](mailto:mpenate@cityoflilburn.com).

Voters must come to Lilburn City Hall to vote in the municipal elections, which are separate from the general election conducted by Gwinnett County Voter Registrations and Elections Office. The City of Lilburn has posted public notices regarding this election in English and Spanish to satisfy the requirements of the Voting Rights Act, 52 United States Constitution §10503.
